the evil by removing the cause. So long as the state is dominated by the great corporations that seek and must have illegal privileges, so long it will be a corrupt system, and every year the corruption will increase...

We therefore appeal to the people of the state of New York to join hands with us and put an end to this intolerable condition. It has gone far enough, and much too far. A government by corrupt plutocracy is of all conceivable things the most repugnant to American traditions and principles...

What is going on in New York is going on in every state of the union. Organized graft is undermining government and undermining it for the benefit of the organized greed that preys upon unorganized need.

For all this there is no conceivable remedy, but Socialism, which makes service for the common good the highest honor, which destroys corruption by destroying its source and cause, which proposes that the work for society now done by private corporations for private gain on the basis of privilege shall be done by the community for the community's benefit.

Other results of the existing system are seen in the increased cost of living that in fifteen years has amounted to an average of 60 per cent, while wages and incomes have increased on the average less than 25 per cent.

MOTORIST HELD FOR MISS HOUGH'S DEATH

Rosenheimer and Companion Denounced by Coroner for Part Played in Fatal Crash.

Declaring the case to be the most brutal and heartless of the kind he had ever dealt with, Coroner Schwann, yesterday held Edward T. Rosenheimer, son of a millionaire needle manufacturer, in \$25,000 bail to await the result of the inquest into the death of Miss Grace Hough, who was one of three persons hurled from a buggy on Pelham parkway Thursday night.

Rosenheimer is charged with having driven an automobile that crashed into the buggy, and with dashing away at high speed after the accident, leaving the then dying girl and her injured companions to care for themselves as best they could.

For the defense Fleischer admitted that he was a guest of Rosenheimer at the time of the crash, but that he had no knowledge of the accident.
