CLEVELAND S. L. P. FOR THE MILITANTS

IN THE FIELD WITH FULL MUNICIPAL TICKET. And All Others Who Are Not In Deep Slumber.

City Convention of the Socialist Labor Party Adopts Rousing Resolutions Against Reformism and for Revolutionary Action—Enthusiastic in Support of S. L. P. Press—Fine Spirit Displayed at Proceedings.

Cleveland, June 7.—The Socialist Labor Party of Cleveland held a well attended city convention yesterday in which the best and most encouraging spirit prevailed.

Committees were elected as follows: On Resolutions, John D. Goerke and Richard Koepfel; on Nominations, Fred Brown, P. C. Christiansen and J. Kirchner.

After these committees had reported, the convention was addressed by Goerke and Kirchner, both of whom made short but stirring speeches.

The following resolutions, as reported by the committee, were unanimously adopted: "The Socialist Labor Party of Cleveland, O., in convention assembled, reaffirms its strict adherence to the national platform, principles and tactics of the Socialist Labor Party of the United States."

In addition there were those sending one new reader, and readers, who of themselves renewed.

On June 26, the Contest between the States begins. New York State and California are the first to enter the lists. From all indications this, the initial contest, will be keenly watched.

We hope that each comrade in New York and California will enter into the spirit of this contest, and by his efforts help spread the propaganda and also safeguard the Party's propaganda institutions.

The following members were then, upon recommendation of the committee, nominated as the candidates of the Socialist Labor Party for the municipal election next fall:

Mayor—John Kirchner. Pres. City Council—Richard Koepfel. City Auditor—P. C. Christiansen. City Treasurer—J. Heidenreich.
