A Roman Catholic paper, the Pittsburgh 'Observer,' in a recent editorial bewails the fact that, by giving people an opportunity to read, Andrew Carnegie is unwittingly making Socialists.

Right opposite the boycott of the Singer advertisement is a line which reads: 'The publishers reserve the right to revoke or reject advertising contracts at any time.' If all advertisers in the 'Federationist' are acquainted with this fact, the A. F. of L. officials know it, there is double collusion on the part of both parties to deceive union men and their sympathizers by inserting advertisements of unfair firms, which is understood to be a bid for the patronage of union men.

The idea of accepting money from a firm for advertising under such conditions is of the same cloth as the action of Gompers in playing hide and seek with the Civic Federation. Both acts subjects the A. F. of L. to well-grounded suspicion, and places the organization in position to be ridiculed by our enemies and made fun of as we should be.
