For the Republican convention at Pocatello was run by a few bosses, as we showed in our full report in last week's "Socialist."

But the Democratic convention at Coeur d' Alene was wor not run by a few bosses, but by one s. Senator Dubois was simply the whole thing.

Without Dubois, the Convention would hardly have been held. He and his "private secretary" have been working up the Convention for everal weeks. The actual number present was carefully concealed by the Clerks and Chairman. But the reporters who sat on the platform could never count over 140, a full hundred short of the number who should have been there.

So it apepars, with all the efforts of Dubois and Arney to awake enthusiasm, and get out "the old war horses," this convention numbered only one-half to two-thirds what it should number.

Without Dubois and Arney, and their artificial stimulation, the convention would have numbered less than one hundred, the merest remnant of a party.

Dubois commanded the Mormon issue and the Democratic Party of Idaho obeyed, transferring itself into a Dubocratic Party.

Two months ago, Dubois wrote & letter from Washington, D. C. to the Democratic Central Committee meeting at Boise, in which letter he outlined this anti-Mormon policy. The State Committee endorsed that letter and policy.

Prominent Democrats who recognized the assininty of that policy, said then: "Wait and see. The State Committee is not the State Convention. At Coeur d' Aiene the Democratic party will speak and not Senstor Dubole"

We have waited and we see. The Democratic Party at Coeur d' Alex was only the trained and performing Donkey of Fritz Dubois. It brayed when he said bray. And its only bray was "Damn the Mormons!

That is the only issue before the Convention. The other things put into the platform are filling, stuffing padding. They will only be mentioned in the campaign to catch the simple minded. Everyone understood when the Bear Lake delegates were kicked out Monday evening, that the Convention was over. All that remained to do as to register the decrees of Boss Dubois. He had worked up the convention beforehand, the delegates were his delegates and they had done his bidding faithfully.

But what about the "Damn-the Mormon-issue?" Why has Dubois forced it on his party?

Because again he hopes to catch Republican votes, especially women's votes, in this state, where women have equal sufferage with men.

The Party Emblem adopted was "The Home," a little cottage representing the home.

Dubos reasons his ticket will get the regular Democratic vote anyhow. and a good many Republican votes who are caught by this neise about the "purity of the home."

It was to make this noise as loud as possible that the Convention was held in the north end of the State. where there are no Mormons, and where the delegates might be duly impressed with he "Damn-the-Mormon" oratory of the Southern members and fired with enthusiasm against the "Hierarchy" of Salt Lake.
