The Workers Party and Nationalization

The Workers Party does not believe that nationalization of the mines will solve the problem of the coal miners while a capitalist government is in power at Washington.

A government that called upon the governors of all the states to fill the coal fields with soldiers so that scabs could get out of the coal which uses courts, injunctions and soldiers against strikers, coal, which uses courts, injunctions and soldiers against strikers, and make the lot of the miners even worse if it owned the mines.

Nationalization of the mines must be accompanied by Workers' Control. The workers who do the work of the coal industry must take over the management of that industry.

The union must have power to decide upon wages, hours and working conditions. It must have absolute power over the safeguarding of the mines. Modern science can eliminate most of the dangers of coal mining. It is only the greed of the employers which makes necessary the yearly toll of lives lost in mine "accidents."
