Attitude of the Socialist Party on Municipal Affairs

Commissioner Salter Makes Statement

From our press and platform we have assured the voters of Everett that we stood for honesty and efficiency in the administration of public affairs. We showed from a wide source of information that Socialists in city government have bettered conditions of labor and the finances of the cities under their influence and control. Also that Socialists have furthered the cause of education, public recreation and amusement. The best possible service has been secured from public service corporations, and such steps as the law allowed were taken leading toward public ownership of all public utilities.

As a means to secure what we have promised, the Socialist party of Everett has unanimously endorsed the plan below, as submitted to it by their representative in the council, Commissioner J. M. Salter.

The Socialist commissioner will work in harmony with his two associates in office in so far as they approve of the following guiding principles of municipal government: That the very best talent be seeined for the various departments. That men who approve

of municipal ownership, and who are imbued with a genuine civic consciousness, and high ideals of social service, will be preferred as city employes. As for the department directly under Mr. Salter's control, all administrative heads in the makie works department will be selected for their special fitness and ability. Other things he-
