Whereas, we are conscious of the fact that the proletariat have no country, but are and should be citizens of the world, and that they have therefore but ONE enemy, the capitalist

"Therefore, be it resolved, that we call upon the working class of the state of Washington, through the Socialist party locals, to hold anti-war mass meetings ;and be it further

'Resolved, that as class-conscious members of the working class we call upon our fellow workers to refuse to take up arms against each other, even to the extent of open revolt should an attempt be made to force us to arms


