Bob Minor To Tour For Cal. Communist Election Campaign

DARCY OFFERS TO DEBATE DEMPSTER, SOCIALIST CANDIDATE

Radio Broadcasts STATIONS KTAB AND KTM TO HAVE COMMUNIST CANDIDATES WEEKLY

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 28.—Bob Minor, nationally known working class fighter, leader of numerous struggles of unemployed in New York and in the South, Communist candidate for mayor of New York in the last election, will tour the state of California next month in the state election campaign.

Minor will take the place of Pat Chambers, Communist candidate for U. S. senator, who is in jail in Sacramento awaiting trial with 17 other workers on charges of criminal syndicalism. He will tour with Harold J. Ashe, Communist candidate for secretary of state, former state secretary of the Socialist Party in California.

Minor-Ashe tour begins in Sacramento on October 13, and will include the following cities and towns:

Protest Against Salinas Terror Sweeps So. Calif.

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 27.—A mighty protest has gone up from citizens of Southern California against the vigilante tactics adopted by super-patriots against workers all over California, particularly in the Salinas section.

Not since Crystal Creek, Colquhoun in 1912, when men, women and children were shot down like predatory beasts with rifles and shotguns, have there been such outrages as in the recent strike of Filipino workers in the Salinas section.

One hundred and fifty representative citizens of Southern California have issued a declaration of their opposition to vigilantism and the lawless enforcement of the law by peace officers, sworn to uphold the constitution.

The protest has reference to the wave of hysteria which has swept over portions of our state, resulting in a re-badging campaign on the part of vigilantes and peace officers that has wrecked halls, homes and offices of so-called radicals, and has further vented its rage in the merciless kidnaping and beating of scores of people and the arresting wholesale of hundreds on trumped-up charges of vagrancy.

Attorneys who have defended the victims of this terrorism have been seized by lawless mobs, beaten and even threatened with death if they continued to appear for members of the militant unions or the Communist Party.

The protest, which is signed by ministers, doctors, lawyers and representative business men, concludes with this appeal: "We invoke the aid of leaders of public opinion and the press in a combined effort to stem the tide of terrorism and to re-educate the people as to the meaning of Americanism under the Constitution."

Will It Be Better To Elect Sinclair Than Merriam?—What Gain to Vote Communist?

We frequently hear honest and sincere, but misled, workers justify their support of Sinclair with the following argument:

"Of course it would be better to elect a Communist ticket, but in this election the Communists haven't a chance, and it is better for us to vote for Sinclair because, at any rate, he is a great improvement over Merriam."

It is just because the capitalist class expects the workers to think along such lines that they have nominated Sinclair. The Democratic Party Convention, held on September 20th in Sacramento clearly showed what the line-up is. The Democratic Party did not surrender to Sinclair. Quite the opposite happened. Sinclair surrendered what little Socialism he ever held to, and gave up completely to the capitalist Democratic Party.

By voting for Sinclair, these workers are therefore voting for the capitalist Democratic Party. What we workers get after Sinclair is elected will not depend upon the non-existent, radicalism of Sinclair, but will depend on what we can force from the capitalist class through our organization and militancy. Sinclair will only give, if he is elected, what the capitalist class wants him to give. Exactly the same thing holds for Merriam. Then what's the difference between the two?

The promises which Sinclair is making remind us of the promises which Roosevelt made. The people of the United States were so anxious to get rid of Hoover that they did not very carefully examine what Roosevelt had to offer. Instead they hurried to vote for him to get rid of

Hoover as soon as possible.

After the election, however, we got from Roosevelt only what we were able to force by strikes, unemployed demonstrations, etc. We got a small measure of unemployment relief and, in some isolated industries, wage raises; not because of Roosevelt's good will, but only because of our militant action. In fact, in the report issued by Madam Perkins, Roosevelt's Secretary of Labor, last month, it was clearly stated that as a result of Roosevelt's NRA program, the purchasing power of the workers, despite wage increases in some industries, has dropped. If the ex-soldiers had any slight hope for a bonus under the Hoover regime, this was permanently killed under the Roosevelt regime, because, with the election of Roosevelt, too many of the veterans went to sleep in the illusion that Roosevelt was better and would give them the bonus. Although Roosevelt, during the election campaign, appeared to oppose Hoover's terror against the veterans and workers, yet since his election more workers have been killed and imprisoned than ever were under Hoover. Many people were misled by Roosevelt's statements on the release of Mooney. But Mooney is still in jail.

This history will repeat itself when Sinclair is elected. Some argue, "Maybe that is so much the better, because by not fulfilling the promises he is now making, Sinclair will discredit himself and the workers will then go to Communism."

Unfortunately that process is not inevitable. In fact, most people who vote for Sinclair think

they are voting for a "radical," or some sort of "mild Communist."

When Sinclair's program fails and the crisis and increased suffering is felt by the workers, in their bitterness they may become fertile ground for fascist agitation; the fascists will use the failure of Sinclair's radical phraseology to discredit the real revolutionary movement. Precisely this role which Sinclair is now playing for the fascists in the State of California was played by the Socialists in Germany and Austria to make way for Hitler and Stahrenberg, and the Syndicalists in Italy, to make way for Mussolini.

By voting for Sinclair, therefore, workers who think they are moving to the left, are really helping Sinclair pave the way for fascism.

We appeal to all workers and other progressive people to leave this road before it is too late.

Only by voting for the Communist Party, and thus lending strength to a practical revolutionary program, can the forces of reaction, including the Merriams and their ilk, be defeated. Even if the most of the Communist Party candidates are not elected, a huge vote for them would constitute a tremendous force of pressure that would bring concessions and improved conditions from the capitalist class. The bosses are not afraid so long as they feel that the workers will continue to vote for one or another brand of capitalist party or candidate. The bosses will only feel their position weakened, and the need for granting improved conditions to workers and the unemployed, when they know that the people are turning towards their own revolutionary Party, the Communist Party.

RANK, FILE CONFERENCE IN S. F. BUILDS FIGHT FOR MORE MILITANT PROGRAM

Fakers Plan No Struggle For Better Conditions of Workers; Concentrate On Drive Against Communists

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 27.—With delegates from all parts of the country attending, the two-day Rank and File Conference called by the A. F. of L. Trade Union Committee for Unemployment Insurance and Relief will organize the fight for greater rank and file control, more militant struggles, and elimination of all abuses existing in A. F. of L. locals.

This Third Annual Conference will be held October 1st and 2nd, simultaneously with the opening of the A. F. of L. National Convention and the program adopted for battling to make the A. F. of L. into a weapon of more militant battle for the working class. The Conference, in two sessions, will be held in Carpenters Hall, 112 Valencia street. The first session is Monday from 10 a. m. to 7 p. m.; the second on Tuesday from 1 to 10 p. m.

Monday night the program outlined by the committee will be heard at a big mass meeting at Eagles Hall, 273 Golden Gate avenue, where Louis Weinstock, national secretary of the A. F. of L. Trade Union Committee, will be the main speaker. Among other points, Weinstock will tell of the recent painters' strike in New York and how the attempt to take the charter away from the militant local #499 was stopped by the rank and file in force all over the country. Finally the General decided to withdraw from the strike, and the workers are probably safer to have 800 militants in one local than to let them spread into twelve locals.

28 Longshoremen Still Being Held In Jail In Portland

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 27.—Twenty-eight longshoremen have languished in jail for several weeks on trumped-up charges in connection with the recent longshoremen's strike. Committees of workers have called daily on the district attorney with resolutions protesting the arrests and holding of these men. He is very gracious to these committees, but says he has no authority to release them, and that they must wait their turn. Their indictments have been delayed while others arrested later have had their hearings.

The excuse given for this was that the officers, making the arrests were on vacation and could not be contacted for hearings. Irvin Goodman, I.L.D. attorney, has been speaking to unemployed organizations in Portland, talking on criminal syndicalism, deportation laws and civil rights, against the framers.

Grand jury indictments of those charged with criminal syndicalism are pending.

Fight For Champion Wins Same Gains For Others On Relief

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 25.—The protest of Clyde Champion and his family, when they paraded the Broadway wearing signs against the forced labor on the garden plots, has had its effect in South Gate and Belvedere. Workers are leaving the gardens in these neighborhoods where Champion has become known as the Communist candidate for congress, and others are refusing to be sent there. Neither have they been cut off relief, not since the issue was forced by the grievance committee which secured grocery, rent, clothing and furniture orders for the Champion family.

Champion, however, is still in the isolation ward of the General Hospital, where the attendants say he is improving and not suffering from infantile paralysis as first believed. Overwork in fighting for relief for his and other families, and bad food, caused his breakdown.

MWIU Seamen Stop Discrimination On S. S. Oakmar

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 27.—The S.S. Oakmar, with a majority of its crew members of the Marine Workers' Industrial Union, came into port last Saturday. Five iceboats that had been aboard left the ship.

The delegate, D. C. Anderson, lined up three new members when two delegates of the International Seamen's Union (A. F. of L.), one of them Webb, intimidated the captain into firing the M.W.I.U. members and agreeing to hire men from the I.S.U. instead. The captain agreed that he did not care what union they belonged to, but did not want the ship tied up because of this.

M.W.I.U. Delegate Anderson went to the National Labor Board and received a letter from them to bring to the captain stating that the men were not to be discriminated against. Mr. Woods, secretary to the Board, called up the secretaries of all I.S.U. locals and emphatically told them to inform their delegates that they should not try to intimidate men or officers of ships and that since according to the arbitration thereon it is supposed to be no discrimination to inform him of any further cases. Realizing from experience that if he did not take this action the M.W.I.U. men would strike and receive support from groups of longshoremen, Woods was forced to fulfill the terms of the arbitration agreement to the letter. More Than 100,000 Locked Out In Big Textile Strike Betrayal

WASHINGTON, Sept. 28.—Following their arbitration sell-out maneuvered through A. F. of L. officials and the Roosevelt government, mill owners are pressing a vigorous campaign of discrimination against union men, more than 100,000 being locked out in the so-called "victorious" return to work.

Temporarily strangled by the treacherous negotiations of their supposed leaders who ordered them back to their jobs without a single demand won or a single concession made by employers, textile workers are rapidly awakening to a realization of their betrayal and militant sentiment is rising in many mill centers for a continuation of the strike. President Roosevelt has appointed

the notoriously reactionary steel board to also serve as the new Textile Labor Relations Board. This committee of three, consisting of Walter P. Stacy, Chief Justice of the North Carolina Supreme Court, Admiral Henry A. Wiley, U.S.N. retired, and Dr. James Mullenbach of Chicago, is endowed with so-called "sweeping powers" to maintain industrial peace in the textile centers. Chairman Stacy of North Carolina is a part of the capitalist legal machine in a state that loosed one of the most vicious fascist attacks against the strikers on the whole textile front. Martial law was declared throughout the state and strikers were denied all relief. Scores of strikers in this state were arrested by the National

Prater, Richmond Candidate, Sues City Over Raid

RICHMOND, Calif., Sept. 17.—A suit against the city of Richmond was filed by W. J. Prater, recent Communist candidate for Public Administrator, whose home and photograph studio at 334 12th street was raided and wrecked on two occasions by vigilantes of Richmond during the wave of terror that struck the San Francisco Bay area at the close of the General Strike. Furnishings and photographic material gathered through years of hard work by Comrade Prater were totally destroyed and rendered useless. He is suing for \$2,308 damages.

During the second wrecking crusade, Comrade Prater asked for police protection but was refused. Damages are \$1,006 for attack on July 17th and \$1,302 on July 18th. (Continued on Page 3, Col. 2.)

L A CLOAKMAKER STRIKE ON IN 26 SHOPS

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 27.—Workers in twenty-six garment shops walked out on strike this morning. Demands are for recognition of the Cloakmakers' Local of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union, and better conditions in the shops.

This action of the workers follows directly on the heels of the sell-out of a garment makers' strike by A. F. of L. officials earlier in the month. The first strike, occurring in the Kaplan & Sons Sportswear Shop under the leadership of the Needle Trade Workers' Industrial Union, was betrayed by the reactionary officials of the I.L.G.W.U. who supplied seals with union books. It was hoped by this maneuver, not only to break the strike, but to force workers into the A. F. of L. union.

Richberg Heads New NRA Board As Strikes Force Johnson Out

WASHINGTON, Sept. 27.—Faced with a huge protest of the working class striking all over the country, President Roosevelt has named two new boards to head the NRA, following the resignation of Gen. Hugh Johnson.

Heading the industrial emergency committee is Donald Richberg, federal relief "coordinator". Other members are Secretary of Interior Ickes, Secretary of Labor Perkins, Federal Relief Administrator Hopkins, Agricultural Administrator Davis and another member who is ostensibly to be chosen by this "new NRA" administrative board.

The administrative board, which will act where Johnson rode before, are: H. Clay Williams, vice chairman of the R. Reynolds Tobacco Co., Winston-Salem, N.

C. Arthur Whiteside, head of Du and Bradstreet, New York; Sidney Hillman, chairman of the NRA Labor Advisory Board and president of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America; Leon Marshall, assistant deputy administrator of NRA policy; Walter Hamilton, chairman of the combined Industrial-Labor-Consumers Advisory Board of the NRA.

A third group, a judicial tribunal, drawn from the Department of Justice, the Federal Trade Commission and the National Labor Relations Board, is to be appointed. The whole move, a result of the increasing rebellion of the working class in strikes against the NRA, which was largely responsible for the strike of the

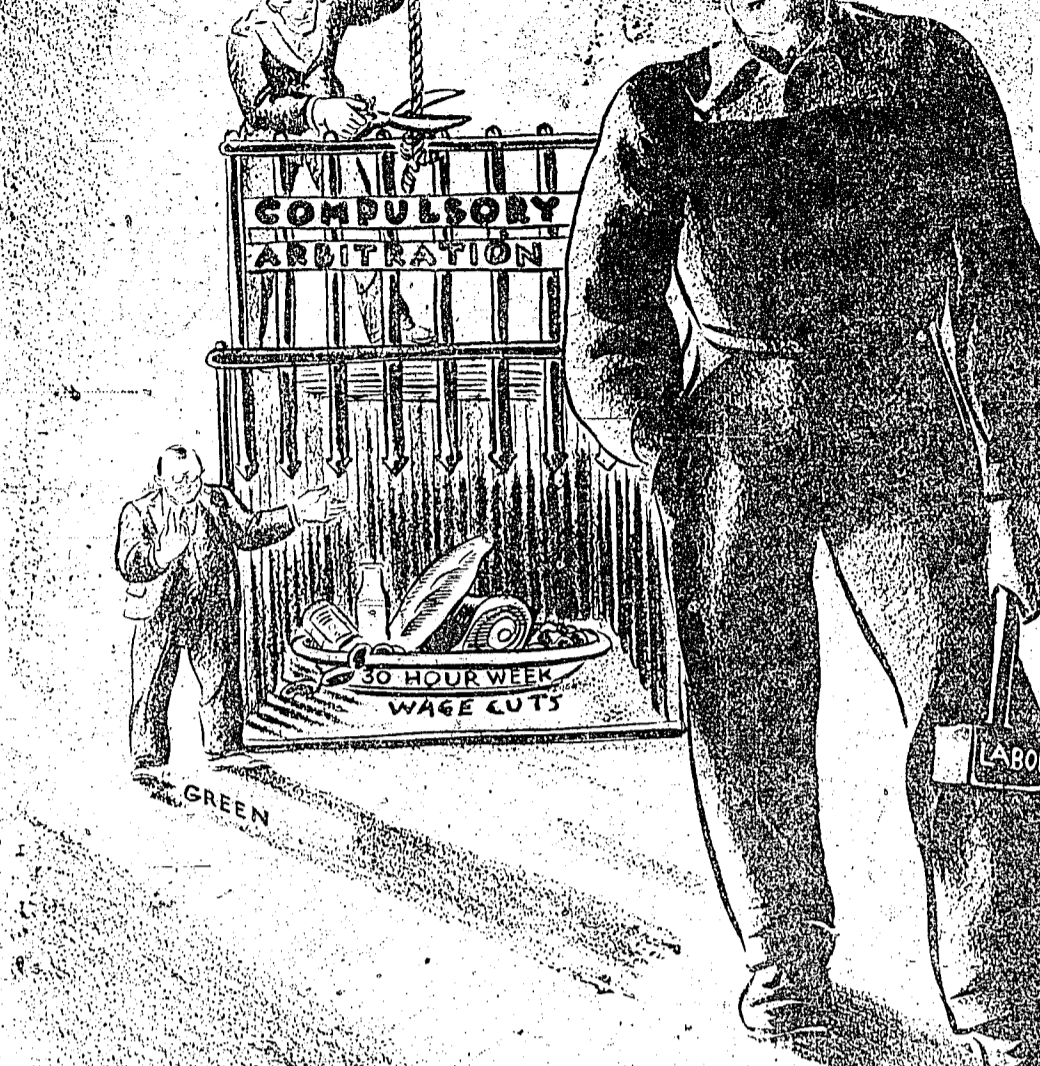

An Appeal To Sinclair Workers

In meetings at which Communist candidates have spoken in various parts of the State, Sinclair workers have spoken up saying that they have seen "the Epic platform sold out under their own eyes."

You can hardly be blamed for that. Since the primaries, Sinclair has been kissing the appropriate part of the anatomy of the Democratic Party politicians, and their bankers and industrial bosses, in the hope of being made respectable, and getting support for his candidacy.

Before the primaries his Epic Platform provided for exemption from taxes on all homes and farms where the owners had less than \$3,000 equity. In his final platform, he has reduced that to property assessed under \$1,000.

Roosevelt's present denial that he ever endorsed Sinclair or his "plan" brought a whining reply from Uppie—"I support the Democratic platform (of Wall Street) with no reservations whatever."

In view of all this reneging even on his own promises, we can well understand why it is that tens of thousands of workers are deserting Sinclair.

BUT TO WHOM SHALL YOU GO NOW?

To Merriam, or Haight? Neither of these gentlemen even promised you anything, and certainly especially Merriam's platform and actions show that all they will give after the elections is what Merriam gave us before the elections, police raids, attacks on workers, arrests, the murder of striking workers, foreclosures on homes and farms, etc.

Epic workers, don't turn from Sinclair to the brutal reactionaries that now rule the State running on a Republican ticket. Turn instead to the Communist Party. A huge vote for the Communist Party will constitute a tremendous pressure to force unemployment insurance, old-age pensions, civil rights for workers, exemption from taxes for poor people and all those other measures that are necessary to immediately improve our conditions.

The Painters Strike

That the nineteen painters' locals affected in the Bay area have a strong militant movement in them is proven in that this strike is being launched against the attempts of Maj. Geo. L. Berry, notorious A. F. of L. betrayer and Divisional Administrator of Building Trades Codes, to postpone it while hearings went on for weeks and the solidarity and militancy were broken bit by bit.

They have but to look at the two struggles mentioned to see what they must do. Immediately all locals must be united with a strong rank and file strike committee, publicity committee, etc. Already the present officials have shown their eagerness to help Berry's maneuver to kill the strike.

In this fight the Western Worker offers its columns to the strikers for their official statements, without any editing on our part. The capitalist papers, as always, will give their full support to breaking the strike.

The Western Worker, as in the waterfront strike, is on the side of the strikers and will willingly publish any statements of the strike committee to help their fight.

What A Communist Vote Means

California School Teacher Is Communist Candidate

Lucile Pyle was born in Michigan, November 30th, 1902, the daughter of workingclass parents. Her father sold papers on the streets of Chicago at the age of eight and so was deprived of more than a few years of schooling. Her mother was the daughter of a small farmer.

The family moved to Los Angeles in 1905 where it was necessary for the father to sell fish during the day and telegraph at the Southern Pacific Co. at night in order to feed the mother and three children.

They moved to Corcoran, Cal., in 1908 where her father became a farmer and was later City Judge and Justice of the Peace. Here, Comrade Pyle attended grammar school and the most of high school. She graduated from Hollywood High School in 1920 and continued her studies at the University of California. She attended the University for five years and received her California State secondary teaching credentials.

Her first appointment was to Narbonne High School in the Los Angeles City school system where she taught science and mathematics. Later she taught Mexican children in the migratory schools near Corcoran. These schools were tents and the desks were crude tables with benches for seats. At the height of the cotton picking season as high as forty pupils were crowded into a tent which was no bigger than eighteen by fourteen feet. In 1931 and 1932 she taught in the Glendale City School system.

In 1933 she moved to Placer-ville and came in contact with the Communist Party in Sacramento where she joined the party in March 1934. She is now Communist Party Candidate for the State Assembly District 6.

SERA Workers Orgquize

Candidate Describes Conditions In Lynwood

SOUTH GATE, Oct. 19.—The Lynwood office of the SERA recently issued work orders to forty-four men for a project in Redondo Beach, 22 miles away.

When they got to Redondo Beach they were told to go back, that there weren't any jobs. They came back to Lynwood, formed a committee and forced a hearing. The local official passed the buck.

He offered them emergency grocery orders, but the men knew that this would mean going back on County Welfare with 40 hours a month on the garden plots. As a committee, they voted it down, together and went to 740 Flower St. in Los Angeles, the office of the SERA. There they elected a small committee and demanded a hearing. When they refused to be denied, the chief office-sitter gave them work orders nearer home and pay for the half day spent in going to Redondo. They are now working toward the organization of a union of SERA workers.

These men are learning how to fight unemployment. Their treatment is the same as that handed to thousands in Long Beach, Watts, in South Gate, in Bellflower—throughout this entire 18th Congressional District.

The action these men took to keep from being chiselled out of their small pittance is the sort of

who help to spread my campaign message of the Communist Party are regularly organizing as part of the campaign.

Activity is reviving in some of the Relief Workers' Protective Unions, but there are also groups of unemployed and SERA workers who are forming the new Public Works and Unemployed League. This organization successfully brings together both the unemployed and the workers on relief projects. This is necessary because both of these groups are subject to forced labor; both

have the problem of poverty to fight against by mass pressure on government officials, and both are being continually shifted back and forth: from unemployed to public worker and back again. the "innocent" Scottsboro boys into the hands of the white ruling class. Mr. Pickens, national field secretary of the N.A.A.C.P., in one of the most damaging editorials in the California Statesman published October 12th, stated:

"More than three years ago when the boys and their parents gave the case to the Communists I told them that whatever they needed to hang them, they had it in these political propagandists who could not serve the Negroes against their party interests. And now I say to the Communists that whatever they need in their arrangements to destroy the boys, they now have it in this involvement in 'bribery' circumstances."

Mr. Pickens takes this cue from the capitalist press which spreads slanderous lies against the boys and their defenders, in spite of the fact that the League of Struggle for Negro Rights issued a statement of this bestial frame-up of the two men arrested in Tennessee and further pointed out how these men were kidnapped, taken across the border into Alabama and later charged with attempting to bribe Victoria Price. Certainly Mr. Pickens read this, but declined to comment. But now that the white ruling class have seen it necessary to attempt to spread lies that the International Labor Defense and the Communist are guilty of bribery, in spite of all the evidence produced in previous trials pointing to the innocence of the boys, such lies are sufficient to convince Mr. Pickens that the boys are guilty. Such an attack upon the defense of these boys by both the N.A.A.C.P. and the capitalist press helped lay the basis for the Alabama Supreme Court to deny these boys' appeal.

The International Labor Defense has repeatedly pointed out to the Negro people that the N.A.A.C.P. is part of the machinery instrumental in chaining the Negro masses to the chariot wheels of capitalism. This is not only shown by the activities of Mr. Pickens but by the whole National Committee of the N.A.A.C.P. Is it any wonder that Dr. Dillard of Tuskegee actually delivered Cliff James, one of the Negro share croppers in the hands of a lynch mob, (December 19, 1932) Since then I have constantly pointed out that the N.A.A.C.P. was the assistant lyncher of the negro people. This is conducted by Mr. Pickens, Schy-labor film named "Call to Arms" by Columbia Pictures.

Announcement of the film was made recently in Louella Parsons' screen column, and the call to protest is being broadcast nationally by the League of Workers' Theaters.

In regards to Mr. Pickens' sympathy with the Communist on race relations, we quote the statement made in Chattanooga, Tennessee by Mr. Pickens almost three years ago: "May the White people of the South set up and notice that this Communist sapping through the densely populated of the ignorant population, will not immediately menacing to the government, it is certainly meaning to cool race relationship."

Certainly Mr. Pickens was not referring to the relationship of the Communist Party, the friendship that is maintained between the Negro upper class (Pickens, DuBois, Van, and Co.) which they maintain with the white ruling class through misleading and betraying the Negroes through distrust that they attempt to create between the Negro and white workers, whose united militant action is the only force that is responsible for the lives of the Scottsboro boys today.

"If anything had been needed to utterly disgust me with the tactics of their leaders, it would have been supplied by their utterly disgraceful activities in the Scottsboro case." Mr. Pickens states further on in the article. What does Mr. Pickens mean by disgraceful tactics? When the Scottsboro boys were framed up by the International Labor Defense, the League of Struggle for Negro Rights, the Communist Party and every working class organization went into the heart of the South and challenged the whole Jim-Crow and social oppression of the Negro population. Of course, such tactics from the very beginning met with the "disapprobation" of Mr. Pickens, Miller, DuBois, and Co. who were by accepting inferior positions and urging the Negro masses to submit to slavery. Such tactics as fighting against Jim-Crowism, lynchings, and for economic, political and social equality and the right of self determination for the Negro people in the Black Belt, the Communist Party will continue to use. Moreover, we shall build and fight every broader struggle in this field. We will also continue to expose every tactic used by you and the whole misleadership of the Negro people.

And as to the finances that were used in the Scottsboro case, the International Labor Defense has on many occasions issued financial statements and stands ready any time to be audited again. But now the question that we raise—What became of the seven thousands of dollars that were raised by the N.A.A.C.P. that were raised ostensibly for Scottsboro? And of course, raised under false pretenses, because the N.A.A.C.P. in the very beginning had no authority to raise a dime for the defense of these boys. This certainly hasn't been accounted for, so all you are doing in your attacks on the defense of these boys is to lay the groundwork for blaming this on the Communists in case this does occur, then the N.A.A.C.P. and the white ruling classes are directly responsible because you have used every method at your disposal to prevent the unity of black and white, which is the only thing that can rescue these boys from the hands of the lynchers.

I am not assuming, however, that they will be lynched, because the International Labor Defense and the Communist Party, the League of Struggle for Negro Rights will mobilize every thing citizen the world over for a continued struggle for the release of the Scottsboro boys, Herndon, Mooney and all class war prisoners.
