

YOUTH PROTESTS NEW DISMISSAL OF INSTRUCTOR

Pennsylvania Students Fill Hall

PHILADELPHIA, June 12. — The staid provincial burghers of Philadelphia saw something they did not expect to see when students and a large number of young workers turned out to protest against the dismissal of Sol Auerbach, instructor of philosophy at the University of Pennsylvania.

Auerbach was fired for praising the treatment of students in the Soviet Union, which he visited as a member of a recent student delegation.

The hall was filled as it had never been before. Many were turned away through lack of seats.

At this meeting Auerbach reviewed in detail his expulsion. Clarence Miller, district organizer of the Young Workers (Communist) League spoke on behalf of the young workers. Juliet Stuart Poyntz, of the New York Workers School, emphasized the class character of institutions like the University of Pennsylvania and told of her experiences in the educational field. Anita C. Whitney, formerly of Leland Stanford University, also told of her experiences. She has served time in California jails for her opinions.

With great enthusiasm a resolution was adopted protesting against the Auerbach ouster.
