

# A Serious Task for World's Workers

**MOSCOW, SOVIET RUSSIA.**—The workers of France, England, Poland, Czechoslovakia and Italy has a serious task before them in the present crisis in Germany. Their governments will try to crush the German Revolution. They will immediately mobilize the border states against Germany. They will supply arms, ammunition and men. A world war far more terrible and destructive than that of 1914 stands before us.

The workers of the United States, too, have a most important duty. The U. S. Government, as in the last war, will at first subsidize the conflict. It will furnish credits, guns, ammunition and supplies—and do good business.

While Europe is busy with Revolution, it will continue its marauding expeditions. The Japanese steamer puts barriers in the path of Japanese imperialism and opens up tremendous perspectives for American penetration of Asia. America will preserve her man-power for later operations in the European turmoil.

It is the duty of the revolutionary workers of America, therefore immediately to carry on a campaign to prevent America's interference with the German Revolution. They must not allow a single ship to leave the

United States with munitions or supplies to be used against the German workers. They must refuse to manufacture or transport munitions and supplies. **THERE MUST BE NO SCABBERY ON THE GERMAN PROLETARIAN REVOLUTION.**

Through its blind greed, capitalism is forcing another Revolution. Goaded on and steeled by hunger and misery, the German workers are the next to give capitalism the answer. The revolutionary workers of the rest of the world must assist the German workers against the international exploiters.
