Zimmerman, who is always ready to attack the progressive forces for the least disagreements with his lengthy reports at membership meetings, lost both his courage and his voice when it came to speaking in behalf of the continuation of price controls. This was in direct violation of a decision of the membership of Local 22 which abortly before his departure to the AFL convention unanimously adopted a resolution for the continuation of OPA.

He also falled to report to the frammakers that he kept mum when the convention adopted a resclution denouncing the CIO for its edul structies which secured 18%-cent increase for millions of werkers and when the convention went on record against wage in-creases as "inflationary" and inctend called for increased produc-tion as the answer to inflation.
